Parson's Ponderings

"In Baptism each Christian is called to ministry in Christ's name. God calls some persons from the midst of congregations to fulfill particular functions, so that the ministry of the whole people of God may flourish. In ordination the church sets apart with prayer and the laying on of hands those who have been called by God through the voice of the church to serve as deacons, ruling elders, and ministers of the Word and Sacrament⁺ In installation the church sets in place with prayer those who have been (previously) ordained as deacons, ruling elders, and ministers of the Word and Sacrament, and are now called anew to service in that ministry. In commissioning the church recognizes other forms of ministry in the church: ruling elders commissioned to limited pastoral service, certified Christian educators, and persons certified to other forms of service" (W-4.0401 Called to Ministry).

The above quote comes from the 2023-2025 Book of Order, which is Part II of the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Just like elders and deacons, Presbyterian pastors are called by congregations to be partners in the ministry of Christ and their ordination vows are all the same with a few specific sentences at the end. The call of the church upon a pastor, elder, or deacon is an important part of their ordination because all three roles are rooted in community.

On November 4, the church, the presbytery, and the community will gather in worship to ordain and install me as the pastor of First Presbyterian Church, Butte. While the event will be full of pomp and circumstance, lots of formality, robed pastors, sermons, music, gifts, and all kinds of to-do followed by what I am told will be an epic reception; nothing will really change. I will go on being your pastor, doing what I've been doing since I was commissioned as lay pastor in January. And yet, lots will change, because this is a worship service filled with the wider body of Christ as they join from all around the state and city to lend their support to your decision to call me as your pastor, and that should give us hope and joy in the work that lies before us.

This day is ultimately about the Triune God. It's a day we publicly acknowledge God's call upon our church to participate in ministry in Christ's name. It's a day we see and experience the anointing of the Holy Spirit upon our congregation as we seek to glorify God in all that we do. It's a day we will hold in our hearts as a promise of God's call upon us to be partners in the work of Christ, because we are all in this together.

Is the Lord calling you to a music ministry? We have a few opportunities:


The **Chancel Choir** rehearses Thursdays at 7pm from Sept. through May.






Kid's Night Out Returns


