# Parson's Ponderings

Jesus' disciples ask, "Who is the greatest in heaven?" and Jesus answers, "Unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven... Whoever welcomes one such child in my name, welcomes me" (Matthew 18:1-5).

Children, in the ancient world, were not valued like they are today. Their only contribution to society came when they were old enough to contribute to the economic welfare of the family through income earning and childbearing. One could say they were the original "be seen and not heard" generation.

Sound familiar? I grew up with parents who often told their children that we were to "be seen and not heard." We grew up with strict rules of how we were to behave around adults, and often those rules implied that we were to remain in another room. If we fought or laughed too loud, we would receive a tongue lashing when we were alone with our parents, often hearing the phrase "be seen and not heard."

We did not institute that policy with our children. As a homeschool family, we often participated in activities that involved all generations. Having kids with us was a natural part of our daily life. But I noticed that many of the churches we attended did not feel the same way. While we kept our kids with us during the service, we were often asked if they would like to go to "children's church." The premise was for them to gain an understanding of the gospel at their level of understanding, but it felt like a "be seen and not heard" situation. While other parents worshipped, I quietly answered the whispered questions of my children.

I am not alone in wondering if our churches have suffered from an unintentional "be seen and not heard" policy. In a book I am reading about intergenerational worship, the authors believe the practice of separating generations during worship, whether through children's church or a contemporary service, was a "perfect recipe for generational isolation [which arose] from an individualistic outlook that emphasizes personal needs rather than communal needs" (Intergenerational Christian Formation by Allen, Lawton, Seibel; 2023 InterVarsity Press, page 39). In other words, why are we surprised when the kids, who were separated from us during worship, do not want to worship with us as adults?

The authors contend that we are not only saved to a private faith, but we are saved to community (page 40). Within community, we learn how to love God and love one another. If our faith is strictly personal, we become individualistic and self-centered. We must worship and participate within a community of faith filled with people of all generations.

With this in mind, we are intentionally bringing the generations together. We will have a "quiet corner" in the front of the sanctuary where children can see what is happening during the service. We brought the nursery upstairs so parents can easily choose to have their children in either the service or in the nursery. We plan to bring the generations together in intergenerational Sunday school classes where we will focus on outreach activities. We look forward to becoming the church that "welcomes children in Christ's name" (Matt 18:5).

The **Chancel Choir** rehearses Thursdays at 7pm from Sept. through May.


The Mile High Bell Ringers rehearse Wednesdays at 9am. If you can read music...you can learn to play the bells!


